

Hiring a contractor?

Tis the season of home repair! Whether you're replacing your roof or renovating your basement, you likely need professional help. Here are a **few questions you should ask your contractor** before giving them the job.

Do.you.have.a.Town.of.Gravelbourg.Business.License?

You can confirm whether your prospective contractor has a business license by consulting the **Business and Service Directory** on the town website or contacting the Town Office.

If your contractor doesn't have a business license, what else might they be cutting corners on? A missing license could be a red flag for other oversights—like lack of insurance, safety certifications, labour malpractice, or compliance with building codes.

PDid.you.know?

Under The Municipalities Act and the town bylaw, the Town can require you to pay a contractor's license fee by deducting it from what you owe them. If the fee isn't paid, the Town can recover it in the same way as property taxes.

Do.you.have.contractor.insurance?

Before work begins, **ask to see your contractor's insurance certificate**—and make sure it's still valid. The certificate should include coverage for property damage and liability insurance. This helps protect you if someone gets hurt or something is damaged during the project.

Do.you.have.WCB.coverage?

If you hire a contractor without WCB coverage, you may be responsible for their WCB premiums and potentially liable for their work-related injuries. You can request a WCB Clearance Letter from the Saskatchewan Workers' Compensation Board to verify if a contractor is covered. You may be required to obtain a clearance before paying the contractor to protect yourself from their overdue premiums.
